

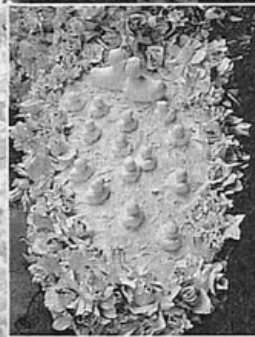
150-lb. gown comes with its very own duck pond

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. — When love struck artist Ed Massey, so did inspiration. He designed and sculpted a floral masterpiece for his fiancée Dawn Harris to wear as she walked, er, rolled down the aisle on a wheeled platform.

The gown took Massey, 35, four months to make and consists of a steel-frame skirt, 1,060 roses crafted from cloth and modeling paste and nine gallons of paint. The dress's train is decked out with model ducks and 14 little ducklings "swimming" in their very own pond.

Harris, also 35, used the platform to take some of the gown's 150 pounds off her slender shoulders during the wedding.
