

The "Garden in Transit-Airborne" DC-3 circa 1930s made its debut at the centennial of flight celebration in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina last winter. About 2,000 children from hospitals all over the country, along with their families, painted floral designs on special self-adhesive material panels shaped in the dimensions of the DC-3. The project, sponsored by Portraits of Hope, was intended to provide creative therapy to children battling serious medical conditions such as cancer, AIDS, burn trauma, heart ailments and other illnesses.
